

October - The Month of The Holy Rosary

By tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to a certain devotion.

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary, one of the best known of all Catholic devotions.

Why is October the month of the rosary? Primarily it is because of the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary celebrated on October 7th. Saint Pius V established this feast in 1573. This was to give thanks for the great victory over the mighty Turkish fleet. The battle took place off the coast of Greece in the Gulf of Lepanto on October 7, 1571. The powerful navy of Muslim forces greatly outnumbered the Catholic

naval forces, primarily from Spain, Venice, and Genoa. St. Pope Pius V called for all of Europe to pray the rosary for victory. We know today that the victory was significant, prevented the Islamic invasion of Europe, and is evidence of the Hand of God working through our Lady.

In October, we also remember the final appearance of Mary at Fatima on October 13, 1917. Tens of thousands of people gathered on that rainy morning at the Cova da Iria and witnessed the miracle of the sun as it change colors. It looked like a revolving ball of fire falling upon the people. When it returned to normal, everything was completely dry. Mary told Lucia, Francisco, and Jacinta that she was the Lady of the Rosary and that they should continue to say the rosary daily.

The purpose of the rosary is to help us mediate on the great mysteries of our salvation. Pope Pius XII called it a compendium of the Gospel. The main focus is on Jesus' birth, life, death, and resurrection. The Rosary's words help to create an atmosphere in which to contemplate the mysteries of God.

Pope Leo XIV asked at the end of his weekly general audience on September 24th for Catholics to pray the Rosary each day in October for peace. October is a magnificent month to start if you don't pray the Rosary regularly or have not prayed it for some time.
